Inquiry

Do the different immigration climates created by state, county, and city regulations affect the internal movement of immigrants within the U.S.?

Immigrant Climate Index

- 2005-present
- Positive and negative laws
- Laws enacted at state, city and county levels
- For city and county laws: weighted as a fraction of the state's population
- Types of laws:
 - Policing
 - Employment
 - Government provided benefits
 - Language, etc.

American Community Survey Data

- We analyze public-use microdata from the 2019 American Community Survey
 - Estimate internal migration flows across 1,005 areas within the U.S.
- Migration status
 - Internal migrants: Those who resided in another area one year before the survey
 - Non-migrants: Those who resided in the same area in the previous year
 - International migrants: Those who resided in another country one year before the survey (not included)
- Spatial analysis of proportion of internal migrants
 - By nativity: foreign born vs. US born
 - By race/ethnicity: White, African American, Hispanic, Native American

Research Plan

- 1. Does Immigrant Climate cause people to move?
 - County level and Individual level analysis
 - rich set of control variables from ACS and economic data from County Business Patterns.
 - time variation in ICI and ACS from 2005-2019 in addition to cross-county variation.
 - Effects on different sub-groups:
 - Nativity: foreign-born, US-born
 - Race/ethnicity:Whites, African Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans
 - Year of immigration
 - Focus on case studies where are sharp swings in ICI (e.g. Colorado)
- 2. Does Immigrant Climate affect *where* people move to?
- 3. Expand analysis to restricted ACS data migration flows across all counties in the U.S.
